#### Call for Submission

It is an exclusive chance for industry and government sectors to share, through live presentations, their challenges, problems, and hopes. It is also chance for applied research labs and centres worldwide to showcase their previous projects and highlight their innovative strategies, roadmaps, and research directions for a better tomorrow. Our goal is to create a market for remote capture innovation by bringing together those with related problems and those with technology solutions.

#### Themes and topics

Submissions by industry and research labs should be related to the conference theme which includes, but is not limited to remote sensing, Laser/LiDAR Sensors, Radar/GPR data sensors, GPS, UWB, RFID, Beacons, photogrammetry, etc. Submissions are also encouraged which focus on the integration of such technologies with applications related to building information modelling (BIM), augmented reality, UAVs, 3D Printing, and/or digital-twin applications, as well as the subsequent analysis of the produced models. Finally, submissions may also present case studies related to the UAV of remote capture technologies in the Architectural, Engineering, Construction, and Facility Management industries.

## Notice of intention and submission processes

To register your notice of intention (NOI) to participate simply respond to the questions below by the due date. Afterwards, the NOI will be evaluated by the technical committee for consistency with the conference theme. After acceptance, you need to send your final submission which is a maximum of two-page summary that includes a summary figure and preferably the corresponding presentation slides or a 10-minute pre-recorded video. Finally, we expect you to present your topic in the conference and participate in Q&A period.


